

WHERE'S THE DRAIN? [*This is a 2011 article that we believe bears reprinting.*] One of our neighbors told of a costly and stressful experience that we thought to pass on to our residents. The homeowner experienced water leakage from the air conditioner/heater closet of their Serenade home. The residents live in a "model 3" (2nd largest of the 4 Serenade models) where the closet is at the end of the long hallway across from the master bedroom. The water leakage was due to a clogged pipe that delivers condensation from the air conditioner to the outside of the home. The amount of water that backed up and leaked was enough to cause the flooring in the hallway to buckle and needed to be replaced. Damage was also done to drywall and baseboards. For a professional (or a layperson, for that matter), the clogged pipe seemed like a fairly routine issue to remedy. However, in this case, even the professional was baffled because there was no finding where the pipe drained out to. It seems that the pipe was buried underneath or next to the cement when the RV pad was poured. Most likely, the pipe is below the foundation level and cement is poured against the stucco, so the pipe is not visible. The professional was able to clear the clogged pipe, but to prevent a recurrence, the owner installed a pump in the closet which is attached to the air conditioner condensation drainpipe. When condensation builds up, the pump will drain the water into the washing machine drain.

We have spoken with many of our neighbors and have found different experiences. Several residents have previously dealt with this issue or something similar. Serenade was built in several phases and each phase has differences. On some homes, the pipe is visible above the foundation or cement pad, or may exit through the stucco wall and the location may be dependent on which model you have. If you wish to share your knowledge with regard to this problem, please email us.
