FROM THE DESK OF THE CHAIRPERSON:

Dear Serenade Neighbors,

In July the Serenade Architectural Control Committee mailed you an Age Verification form, as required by the State of California and the federal government, to keep our legal status as a certified 55+ age-restricted senior community. If you haven't done so, please fill it in and return it as soon as possible. We must keep records showing that we have verified residents' proof of age; you may black-out the actual ID numbers. This information will be shredded as soon as it is verified by SACC. If you prefer, someone from the SACC will come to your home and visually verify your information without recording it. Why should we want to keep our 55+ status? 1. Our newsletter, website, Neighborhood Watch/Block Captains, neighborhood parties, events, and clubs give us a sense of real community and security that you rarely find in ungated neighborhoods. 2. We don't pay dues, yet we still have CC&Rs (Covenants, Conditions, & Restrictions) that encourage yard and home maintenance and upkeep. 3. While our grown kids and our grandchildren can visit us, "No kids living here" means a quieter, more peaceful atmosphere on our streets: no teens doing wheelies on their bikes or partying loudly into the wee hours. So, please fill out and return a form for each person living in your home – relatives, caregivers, and disabled persons, or others. Thank you for helping Serenade stay beautiful and certified as a senior community.

LETTER FROM A LONGTIME RESIDENT: I would like to express my sincere appreciation for the support of my neighbors and friends in our Serenade Association. She located other nice ladies and men who volunteered to assist me and my son, who lives in Colorado. The ladies sorted my clothes and personal needs for my assisted living facility since I was unable to return to my home to do anything after my release from the hospital. I asked Linda to hold a garage sale and to assist my son with all outstanding matters, which she did. I lived alone on Potomac Drive for 26 years and had no idea there were such nice and helpful people in our Serenade community who were willing to help on a volunteer basis with such an urgent matter. I am sorry it took me so long to find out. Again, thanks to all who assisted with my emergency situation and more importantly the help given to my son. God bless to all. -- *Faye Howe*

SERENADE FRUIT & VEGETABLE CO-OP: Do you have fruit growing in your yard that you're not especially fond of? In August, Lisa Schneider started coordinating a new project in our community to address these issues. The Co-op helps Serenade residents share their excess produce with each other. Just call, text, or email Lisa to sign up and learn more. If you have produce to share, give her a week or so advanced notice before it's ready to harvest. If you have produce but are unable to pick it, let Lisa know. Or, if you could help Lisa pick other people's fruit, tell her. She will set the produce out in the shade for Serenade neighbors to come by and take (be sure to bring your own bag). There's no money involved, and you're more than welcome to take produce even if you don't have any of your own to share.
