Dear Serenade Neighbors,

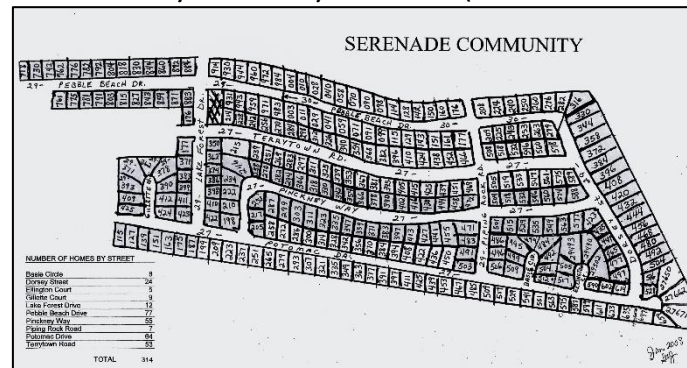
To those of you who have turned in your Serenade Age Verification forms, thank you. The Serenade Architectural Control Committee has been hard at work processing these forms, which we sent out last July. Again, why do we need you to do this? Because, if we cannot prove to the State of California and the federal government that almost everyone in Serenade is over 55, we will lose our legal status as a certified 55+ age-restricted senior community. We currently have not received enough verifications to maintain our status. Therefore, in December we sent out a second postage-paid mailing, but only to addresses (owners and renters) from whom we haven't yet received a reply. If you have received this second letter, please fill it in and mail it to us as soon as possible. Again, *you may black out the actual ID numbers. This information will be shredded as soon as it is verified by SACC.* Or, if you prefer, someone from the SACC will come to your home and visually verify your information *without recording it.*

So, why does it matter for us to keep our 55+ status anyway? 1. We don't pay dues, yet we still have legal Covenants, Conditions, & Restrictions (CC&Rs) that guide and encourage yard and home maintenance and that keep our property values high. 2. As stated in our CC&Rs, your under-55 caregiver can live here full-time, and guests under 55, including our grown kids and grandkids, can visit us for up to 60 days per year (consecutive or not), but the fact that kids can't live here full-time means more peaceful atmosphere on our streets. 3. Our newsletter, website, Neighborhood Watch

/Block Captains, events, and clubs provide a sense of community and security rarely found in ungated neighborhoods. So, please fill out and return a form for each person living in your home – relatives, caregivers, and disabled persons, or others. Thank you for helping Serenade stay beautiful and certified as a senior community.

WHAT ARE SERENADE'S BOUNDARIES? Residents often assume that all the houses east of Bradley and north of Potomac up to El Rancho are in Serenade. But NO, that's not true at all. What are Serenade's exact boundaries? Which houses are IN Serenade and which are NOT? Here you go: A) ALL of Potomac east to Dorsey, starting at 27115 Potomac; none of the homes from Bradley to Gillette are in Serenade. B) None of Reading and none of Terrytown west of Lake Forest are in Serenade, except for 27176 and 27177. C) All the homes on Terrytown are in Serenade from 27176 east to Dorsey, *except* 27202 (originally meant to be built as the Serenade Clubhouse, which sadly never happened). D) Both sides of Pebble Beach from Bradley to Dorsey are IN, *except* 29919 (also meant as Clubhouse property). E) All of Lake Forest and Piping Rock from Potomac to Pebble Beach, and all of Gillette, Basie, Ellington, Dorsey, and Pinckney. So now you know! (Go to the home



page at SerenadeAcc.org to see this map in color and much bigger.) Remember, our CC&Rs include who may live in a 55+ community and how we must keep up our property. Our neighborhood is gorgeous and we should all be proud of it! People who live outside of the Serenade boundaries do not have to follow our CC&Rs, which can account for the state of disrepair of some properties that you see as you enter or leave the neighborhood.

BLOCK CAPTAINS & Y.A.N.A.: Serenade's great Block Captains are connecting with volunteers from the You.Are.Not.Alone program at the Menifee Police Department; Y.A.N.A. volunteers regularly call and visit older and disabled people to make sure their needs are being met by someone. If YOU need some help, contact Linda Davis, head of Serenade's Good Samaritans, and

she can help you apply for Y.A.N.A., (928) 830-7131 or zladyd@aol.com. But perhaps you assume that you and your immediate neighbors currently have a Block Captain, when in fact, half of the 314 homes in Serenade do *not* – because no one has volunteered from a particular section. This can be problematic for the very elderly and/or disabled people in Serenade, and especially those whose family lives any distance away. Truly, being a Block Captain requires almost no time or effort at all. They introduce themselves to their nearby neighbors and then relay any needs to Linda and to Neighborhood Watch – Block Captain Chairman Brian Engelhardt, a retired police officer and a Menifee PD volunteer, and they follow up. SPOTLIGHT ON A REMARKABLE NEIGHBOR:

Sean Kevany (Terrytown Rd) served for 7+ years as a police officer in New Orleans. In 2005 during Hurricane Katrina, while rescuing an elderly woman, he was burned by chemicals in floodwaters and evacuated to Lake Charles, LA, and then to California to recover. He is a U.S. Marine Corps veteran, having served for 11 years (active and reserve time), with 4 years in SW Asia/Saudi Arabia and Kuwait and 4 years in Afghanistan. Since 2014 he has served as a Floor Deputy at the Cois Byrd Detention Center in Murrieta. He works 3 or 4 12.5-hour days/weekly, most holidays, and is often held over or brought in early for an additional 4 hours per day, depending on staff levels.
